In the summer of 1970 legendary but self-destructive director Orson Welles returned to Hollywood from years of self-imposed exile in Europe and decided it was time to make a comeback movie. Welles swore it wasn't autobiographical. *The Other Side of the Wind* was supposed to take place during a single day, and Welles planned to shoot it in eight weeks. It took twelve years and remains unreleased and largely unseen. Orson Welles's *Last Movie*, by Josh Karp is a fast-paced, behind-the-scenes account of the bizarre, hilarious and remarkable making of what has been called "the greatest home movie that no one has ever seen." Funded by the Shah of Iran's brother-in-law, and based on a script that Welles rewrote every night for years, a final attempt to one-up his own best-work. It's almost impossible to tell if art is imitating life or vice versa in the film. It's a production best encompassed by its star, John Huston, who described the making of the film as "an adventure shared by desperate men that finally came to nothing."

Adonis' influence on Arabic literature has been likened to that of T. S. Eliot in the English-speaking world. Yet alongside this spearheading of a modernist literary revolution, the secular Syrian-born poet is also renowned for his persistent and staunch attacks on despotism across the Arab world. In these conversations with the psychoanalyst Houria Abdelouahed, Adonis brings into sharp relief the latest wave of violence and war to engulf Arabic countries, tracing the cause of ongoing tensions back to the beginnings of Islam itself. Since the death of the prophet Muhammad, Islam has been used as a political and

economic weapon, exploiting and reinforcing tribal divisions to aid the pursuit of power. Adonis argues that recent events in the Middle East – from the failures of the Arab Spring to the rise of ISIS and the bloody war in his native Syria – attest to the destructive effects of an Islamic worldview that prohibits any notion of plurality and breeds violence. If there is to be any hope of peace or progress in the Arab world, it is therefore imperative that these mentalities are overcome. In their place, Adonis urges a new spirit of enquiry, embodied in the freedoms to interrogate the past and to question cultural norms. Adonis' penetrating analysis comes at a critical time, offering an alternative path to the cycle of violence that plagues the Arab world today.

Conversations with Houria Abdelouahed Simon and Schuster

In *Ethics–Politics–Subjectivity*, Simon Critchley takes up three questions at the centre of contemporary theoretical debate: What is ethical experience? What can be said of the subject who has this experience? What, if any, is the relation of ethical experience to politics? These questions are approached by way of a critical confrontation with a number of major thinkers, including Lacan, Genet, Blanchot, Nancy, Rorty and, in particular, Levinas and Derrida. Critchley offers a critical reconstruction of Levinas's notion of ethical experience and, questioning the religious pietism and political conservatism of the dominant interpretation of Levinas's work, develops an ethics of finitude which, far from being tragic, opens on to an experience of humour and the comic. Using this reading of Levinas as a way of unlocking the rich ethical potential of Derrida's work, Critchley outlines and defends the political possibilities of deconstruction. On the basis of Derrida's recent work, Critchley attempts to rethink notions of friendship, democracy, economics and technology.

Un viaggiatore che avesse circumnavigato il globo all'inizio del XV secolo sarebbe rimasto stupito dalle incredibili disparità fra l'emisfero orientale e quello occidentale. Per lo storico Niall Ferguson, la risposta va individuata in quelle che, con un'espressione presa a prestito dall'informatica, definisce "applicazioni vincenti", cioè gli strumenti di civiltà di cui l'Occidente - a differenza dell'Oriente - ha saputo dotarsi: competizione (generata dalla decentralizzazione della vita politica ed economica), ricerca scientifica (in particolare in campo bellico), proprietà privata (e nascita dello Stato di diritto), medicina (e allungamento della vita media), consumismo (che ha dato il via alla Rivoluzione industriale) ed etica del lavoro (il collante morale necessario al nuovo ordinamento sociale).

Occidente è, dunque, uno straordinario viaggio attraverso i secoli per capire come una cultura sia riuscita a produrre uno spettacolare progresso in termini di ricchezza economica, assetto politico-istituzionale e tecnologia. E come abbia potuto "contagiare" - con il fascino dell'idea di libertà e la forza irresistibile del mercato, ma anche con la violenza della guerra e del colonialismo - il resto del mondo, cambiandone per sempre la fisionomia. È solo attraverso l'indagine sulle radici di questa duratura supremazia che potremo comprendere se quello a cui stiamo assistendo in questi anni di profonda crisi economica e sociale è davvero il tramonto dell'Occidente e, insieme, l'alba di una nuova era.

Klein argues that by capitalizing on crises, created by nature or war, the disaster capitalism complex now exists as a booming new economy, and is the violent culmination of a radical economic project that has been incubating for fifty years.

It is free to read at Oxford Scholarship Online and offered as a free PDF download from OUP and selected open access locations. *Borderlands: Europe and the Mediterranean Middle East* proposes a profound rethink of the complex relationship between Europe—defined here as the European Union and its members—and the states of the Mediterranean Middle East and North Africa (MENA), Europe's 'southern neighbours'. These relations are examined through a borderlands prism that conceives of this interaction as of one between an empire of sorts, which seeks to export its order beyond the border, and the empire's southern borderlands. Focusing on trade relations on the one hand, and the cooperation

on migration, borders, and security on the other, the book revisits the historical origins and modalities of Europe's selective rule transfer to MENA states, the interests underwriting these policies, and the complex dynamics marking the interaction between the two sides over a twenty-year period (1995-2015). It shows that within a system of structurally asymmetric economic relations from which Europe and MENA elites benefit the most, single MENA governments have been co-opted into the management of border and migration control where they act as Europe's gatekeepers. Combined with specific policy choices of MENA governments, Europe's selective expansion of its rules, practices, and disaggregated borders have in fact contributed to rising socio-economic inequalities and the strengthening of authoritarian rule in the 'southern neighbourhood', with Europe tacitly tolerating serious violations of the rights of refugees and migrants at its fringes. Challenging the self-proclaimed benevolent nature of European policies and the notion of 'Fortress Europe' alike, the findings of this study contribute to broader debates on power, dependence, and interdependence in the discipline of International Relations.
